Instructions

GENERAL INFORMATION

Applicants who have or will have received a bachelor's degree (or its equivalent) from an institution of acceptable standing may apply for admission to the Graduate Division of the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). To start this process contact the graduate program you are interested in and begin the application process. You can get information on these programs by contacting them directly (see page 3), or online at <http://saawww.ucsf.edu/graduate/>

If you have enrolled previously at UCSF as a graduate student in a regular session and you are applying for readmission into the same major with the same degree objective, obtain an Application for Readmission from the Office of Admission and Registrar, Millberry Union 200W.

If you applied for graduate study at UCSF previously, but did not enroll, you must submit a new application form, application fee of \$60.00, transcripts, and all other supporting documents, from any college or university you attended. Previously submitted applications and materials are not kept by the Graduate Division or graduate programs.

APPLICATION FEE

A nonrefundable fee of \$60.00 must accompany your application. The fee must be in U.S. dollars. The remittance should be made by check or money order, payable to "The Regents of the University of California." A \$10.00 fee will be charged for any check returned by the bank. Your UCSF application and the application fee should be submitted to Office of Admission and Registrar in the gray envelope provided. All other material should be sent to the graduate program to which you are seeking admission.

If you are a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident and demonstrate financial need, you may be eligible for a waiver of the application fee. You may access a fee waiver application form on the Graduate Division web-site at <http://www.ucsf.edu/graduate/>. Submit the fee waiver application form with your application for admission.

Your application for admission will not be processed until a decision on your fee waiver has been made. Thus, you are encouraged to pay the \$60.00 fee so that your application can be processed. If your request for an application fee waiver is approved, UCSF will refund your \$60.00 fee.

TRANSCRIPTS

Ask the Registrar of each postsecondary institution you have attended, including UCSF, to forward an official transcript to the graduate degree program to which you are applying. (Program addresses are listed on page 3.)

Only official transcripts showing the Registrar's signature and the seal of the institution are acceptable. An official transcript from each institution you attended is required; a summary of credit transferred from another institution is not acceptable. You should request that your transcripts be sent at the time you file your application.

All transcripts and documents that you submit as part of your application become the property of the Graduate Division and may not be withdrawn, borrowed, returned to you, or sent elsewhere.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Letters of recommendation in support of your application for admission should be sent directly to the graduate program to which you are seeking admission. We suggest that you provide your references with pre-addressed envelopes.

GRADUATE RECORD EXAMINATION

The general test of the Graduate Record Examination is required. Scores must be recent (within the past five years) and should be reported to UCSF by the Educational Testing Service. Many graduate programs also require a GRE subject test. Check with the graduate program office to determine if a subject test is required. Information concerning these examinations may be obtained from Educational Testing Service, CN 6000, Princeton, NJ 08541-6000. FOREIGN STUDENTS

Foreign students from non-English speaking countries are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). If you have attended an American college or university for a one-year period, this requirement may be waived. Arrangements for the TOEFL can be made through the Educational Testing Service, CN 6154, Princeton, NJ 08450-6154, USA. A minimum score of 550 on the TOEFL paper examination (minimum 213 on the computer version) is required for admission. Upon admission foreign students are required to complete a Confidential Financial Statement Form to obtain a visa. The website for TOEFL information is <http://www.toefl.org>

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION DECISION

Admission to graduate study is limited by the number of places available in degree programs. Since admissions committees base decisions upon careful comparison and contrast of applications, there may be a considerable but unavoidable delay before final action is taken. To check on the status of your application, contact the graduate program to which you are applying. The Graduate Division will notify you regarding your final admission status.

STUDENT RECRUITMENT

The Graduate Division and the Schools of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy conduct student outreach and recruitment activities to promote health science education and careers, and to attract a diverse student body to the UCSF graduate and professional degree programs.

The Graduate Division is committed to providing opportunities to individuals from all backgrounds to pursue academic research careers. - Have letters of recommendation sent to the graduate program to which you are applying.
- Mail all other application materials (department/program application, statement of purpose, etc.) to the graduate program to which you are applying.
