Dr. Jacqueline Burgette is a clinician-investigator in oral health services research with a board-certification in pediatric dentistry and a PhD in health policy and management. She earned her DMD degree at Harvard School of Dental Medicine. After receiving her pediatric dentistry certificate, doctoral and postdoctoral training at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Dr. Burgette joined the faculty of the University of Pittsburgh School of Dental Medicine. She serves as an Assistant Professor in the Departments of Dental Public Health and Pediatric Dentistry at the School of Dental Medicine. In addition, Dr. Burgette is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Graduate School of Public Health.

Dr. Burgette's research addresses oral health disparities in children through health services research. She runs a multisite social network study, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and several locations throughout the state of West Virginia. Her research uses mixed qualitative and quantitative methods to study the impact of mothers' social networks on children's oral health utilization, practices and dental caries experience in Northern Appalachia. Dr. Burgette's research is supported by the Robert Wood Johnson Harold Amos Medical Faculty Development Program.

Dr. Burgette's research has appeared in the *Journal of the American Dental Association*, *Journal of Public Health Dentistry*, *Journal of Dental Research*, *Health Services Research* and the *American Journal of Public Health*. Her work also has been recognized by the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, American Association of Public Health Dentistry, American Association for Dental Research and American Public Health Association. Dr. Burgette recently received the 2020 IADR Joseph Lister Award for New Investigators from the International Association for Dental Research for her innovative work on social networks and oral health.
